Current Surveillance of the HIV Epidemic

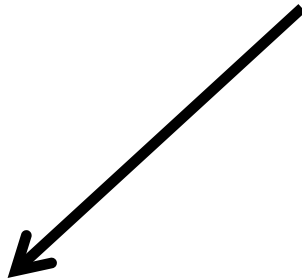
- **Current statistics/ M&E data collection systems are based on number of activities conducted/ tests conducted**
- **Not number of people receiving services: outreach or clinical**



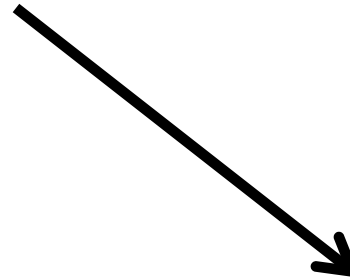
Condom Distribution

(25 condoms each)**



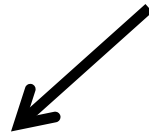
**100 condoms to 10 people?

STI Tests



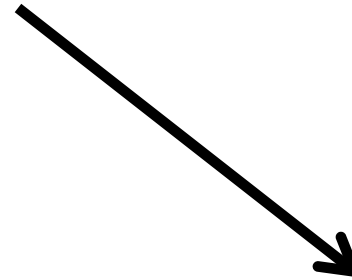
10 STI referrals conducted in one month



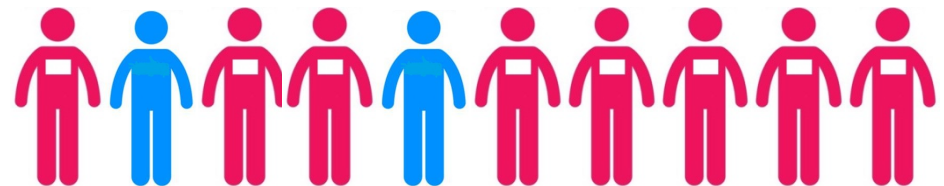
10 STI referrals to 10 people?

(1 person received 2 referrals)**



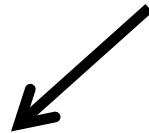

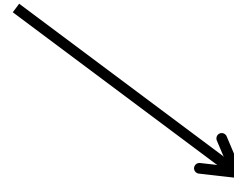

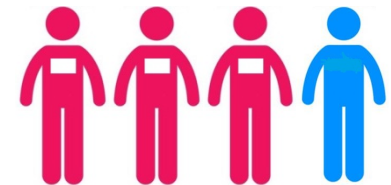

Unique Identifier Code

- ❑ **Unique** – only one of its kind
- ❑ **Identifier** – relates to a person
- ❑ **Code** – set of letters and numbers with no apparent meaning
- ❑ Code given to individuals to help track their movements through the continuum of prevention, treatment and care services
- ❑ One code per person

Unique Identifier Code

- Provides a confidential and reliable system for tracking members of key populations (and general population) through prevention, treatment and care services
- Monitors services received by members of key affected populations
- Monitoring mobility of KAPs through outreach and clinical services
- Monitoring of staff / volunteer performance
- Counts individuals – not activities

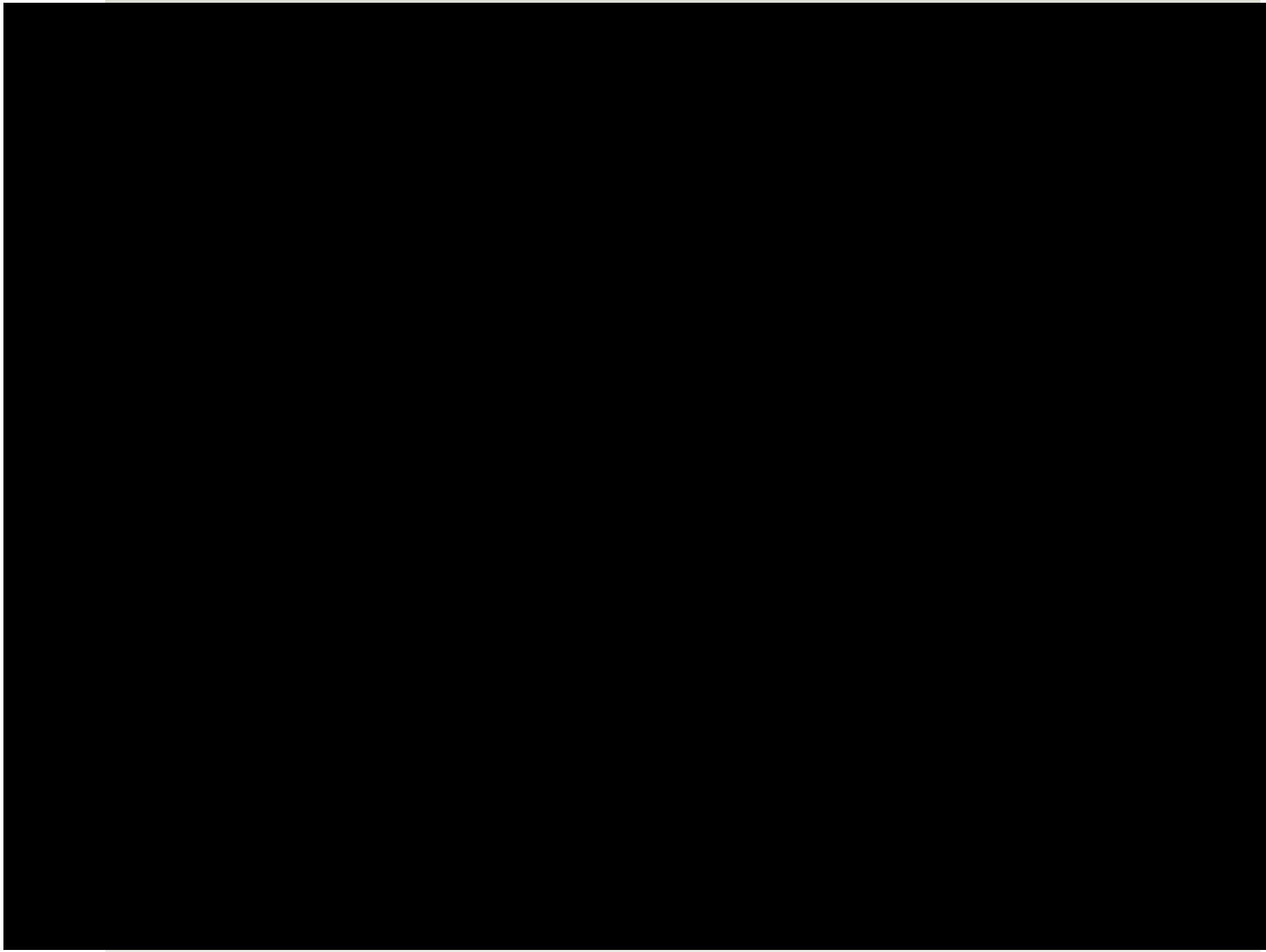

What is a UIC? How is it generated?

- **Set of 8 letters and numbers**
- **Client-generated**
- **Non-identifying**
- **Unique to particular individuals (< 2% repeat)**
- **Mix of letters and numbers**
- **Simple**
- **Easy-to-remember**
- **Non-changeable data**
- **Easy-to-remember prompt questions**
- **Acceptable to the population**
- **Not tied to a location or agency**
- *Low-refusal-no distress – reduces false answers*

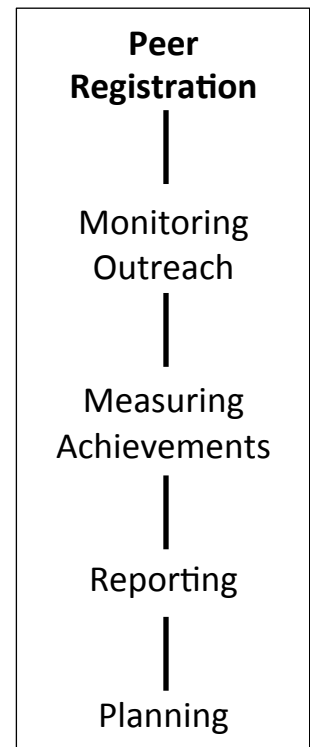

How TL Uses UIC: Peer registration

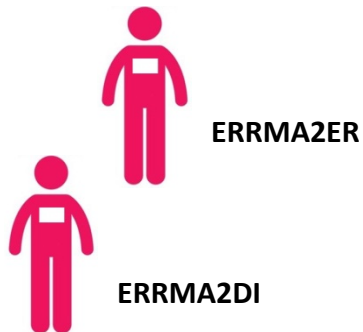


- **Currently 2526 peers registered**

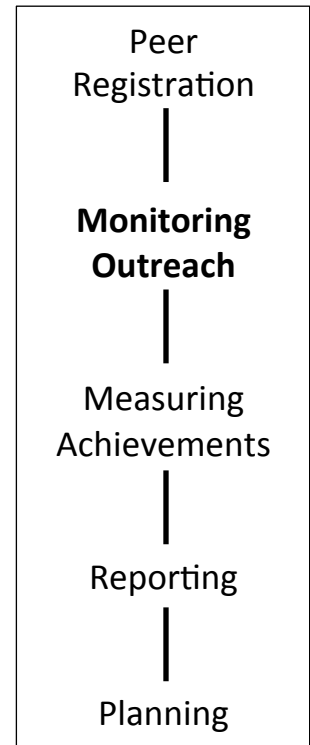


How TL Uses UIC: Monitoring outreach



- **Number of times each peer receives:**
 - Outreach (HIV, STI, SRH, VCT, Alcohol Harm Reduction, Gender Based Violence Harm Reduction)
 - Referrals (STI, VCT, Care and Support)
 - Condoms (Male, Female)

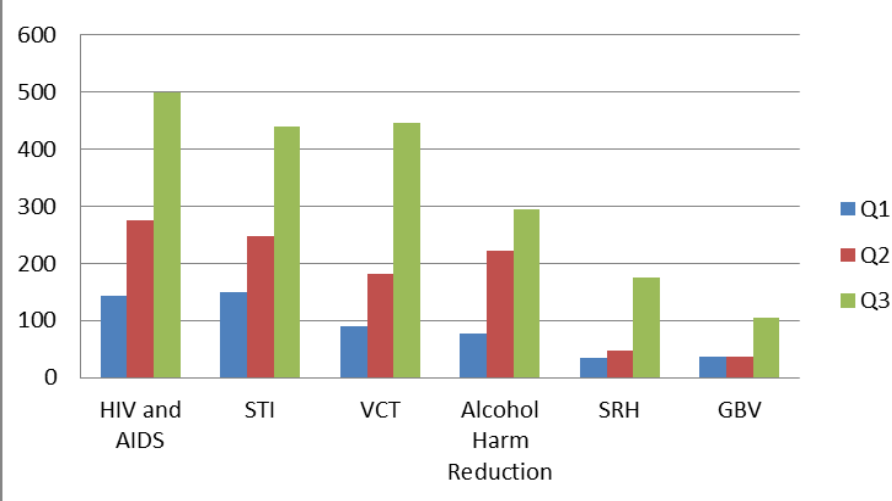


How TL uses UIC: Reporting

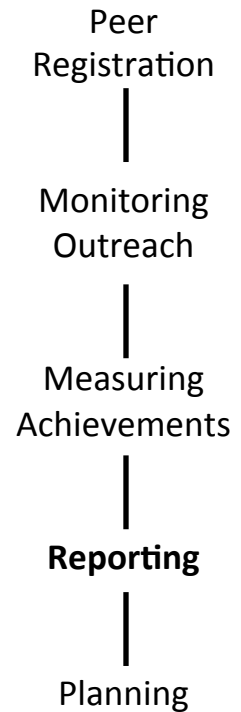
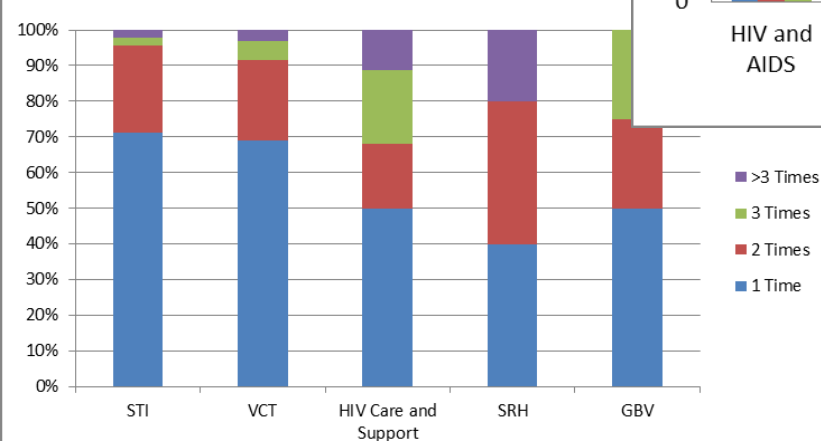
Number WES received referrals

Lessons Learned

- Importance of maintaining confidentiality and trust of clients
- Literacy levels to be considered
- Importance of training field teams
- Importance of a good database
- Establishment of revised M&E systems, tools and databases can be disruptive



Lessons Learned

- Increases engagement of key populations with health and outreach services
- Improved service focus on key populations
- Coverage data for individuals and populations
- Minimum package of services targets:
 - Individuals receiving defined outreach and health services
 - Referrals and reporting collaboration
- Project partnerships and advocacy (regional response).
- Counting people – not activities
- Provides confidential way to track key populations through prevention and care services
